

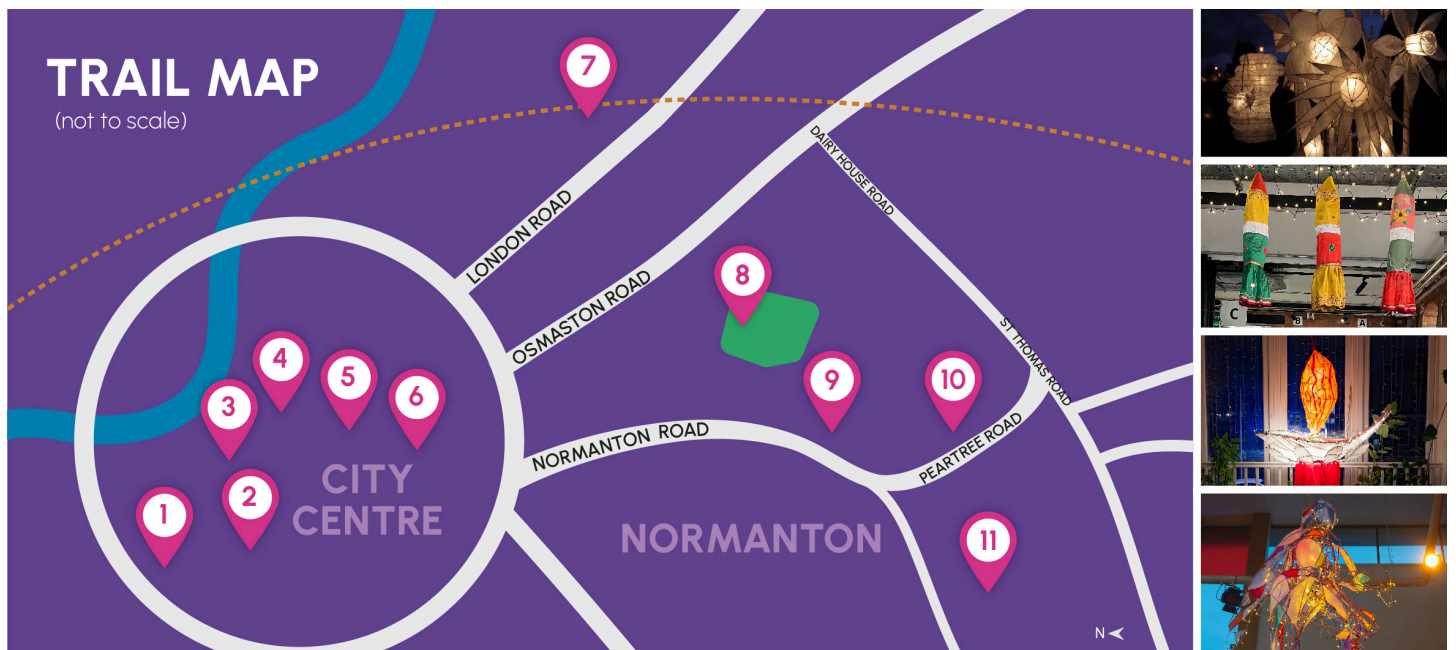
DERBY SEASON OF LIGHT

St.Peter's Church is proud to be one of the locations for this year's Lantern Sculpture Trail as part of Derby Season of Light 2024 festival.

Commissioned by Surtal Arts, eight emerging artists from Derby & Derbyshire will create 11 stunning giant lantern sculpture in a trail through the city. Inspired by the theme of climate action, the "World of Flowers" trail will see 1-3metre high LED-lit lanterns, made of eco-friendly or recycled materials, appear in eleven different locations around Derby city and Normanton - connecting Derby's diverse communities and places. Families can go hunting for these special sculptures while discovering new places, people and stories and take pride in the city we call 'home'.

About the Sculpture at St.Peter's Church

Title: Flower Bearing Angel

A development of the angel created for and displayed in Derby Cathedral in 2022. Mindful of the current wars and disputes across the world I have given the angel a gift to give those who enter this space. Perhaps a little solace and an ambition of a better world to share.

Artist: Frazer Johnston

A Derby based artist, Frazer Johnston has 30 years of experience of working solo and collaboratively, often in communities, particularly in schools. His training is in Industrial Design Engineering but has spent much of his life in community arts and education with a real focus on working outside. Using everyday materials and developing making skills has particularly helped children in Science Technology Engineering and Maths.

He loves developing creative adventures on his own or with other artists or participants giving people a playful opportunity, to draw together ideas and with each other, whilst harnessing and developing making skills. He draws inspiration from people and places around him, aiming to realise the possibilities yet suitability for the environment.

Whether he works on his own through commissions or he works with people in the community or in education, Frazer believes that everyone should experience high quality arts that gives them personal and collective achievement, and exciting and magical outcomes.

The mental health that comes with the 'hand, heart, head' has never been more important. His community works have involved gardens and ponds, kinetic installations, indigenous timber structures, projections, processional puppets and banners, fire sculptures, water installations, mosaics, murals, lantern processions and kite creations. His own work is concerned with creating large scale sculptures or lighting pieces, decorative steel and timber, either in landscapes, municipal spaces, school grounds, private homes or town halls. His current focus is the exploration of kinetic water works with additional needs children and willow lanterns. Frazer has worked on many private and public commissions.
